## ECONOMY

H.R. 142 / S. 485

### **REINS Act**

*Rep. Cammack (R-FL-03),  
Sen. Paul (R-KY)*

Establishes a congressional approval process for major rules that result in an economic cost of at least \$100 million, significantly increase prices for consumers, or create adverse effects on competition, employment, or investment.

H.R. 5130 / S. 2721

### **Prevent Government Shutdowns Act**

*Rep. Arrington (R-TX-19),  
Sen. Lankford (R-OK)*

Keeps Congress in session focused on appropriations bills until all are enacted and extends current funding to avoid disruption while Congress finalizes appropriation bills.

H.R. 4776

### **SPEED Act (Passed the House)**

*Rep. Westerman (R-AR-4)*

Reforms the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) review process by expanding the number of actions that do not need a NEPA review and stopping any agency from considering environmental factors if it is outside their discretion.

## HEALTH CARE

H.R. 4206 / S. 1261

### **CONNECT Act**

*Rep. Thompson (D-CA-4),  
Sen. Schatz (D-HI)*

Permanently extends the health care flexibility that was made available during the pandemic under Medicare, including allowing rural health clinics and federally qualified health centers to offer telehealth, removing in-person requirements and geographic restrictions. Telehealth was used by over 60 million Americans last year alone.

### **Medicare and Medicaid Fraud Prevention Act**

*Rep. Peters (D-CA-50),  
Rep. Evans (R-CO-08)*

Requires states to regularly check the Social Security Administration's death file for deceased physicians and medical device providers to ensure payments are only going to eligible physicians, nurses, and medical device providers.

### **HSAs for All Act**

*Rep. Bean (R-FL-4)*

Expands access to Health Savings Accounts by allowing anyone with a qualifying health plan, regardless of whether it is a high-deductible plan, to open and contribute to an HSA. Qualifying plans are expanded to include any ACA marketplace or employer-sponsored plan.

## IMMIGRATION

H.R. 2672 / S. 1298

### **Religious Workforce Protection Act**

*Rep. Carey (R-OH-15),  
Sen. Kaine (D-VA)*

Allows R-1 visa-holding religious workers to stay in the U.S. beyond the five-year limit so they can keep serving their communities while waiting for long-delayed green cards. It also eases rules so they can change roles within their religious organization and avoid being forced abroad during the process, helping keep congregations staffed and stable.

H.R. 5528 / S. 2886

### **America's CHILDREN Act of 2025**

*Rep. Ross (D-NC-2),  
Sen. Padilla (D-CA)*

Allows the 250,000+ children of long-term visa holders brought to the U.S. lawfully as children to maintain their status for 10 years as well as to graduate from college or university. Age-out protections are also established to prevent them from aging out of their pending green card application.

## TELLING THE LATINO STORY

H.R. 1330 / S. 1304

### **Smithsonian Museum of the American Latino**

*Rep. Malliotakis (R-NY-11),  
Sen. Padilla (D-CA)*

Permits the Smithsonian National Museum of the American Latino to be located within the Reserve of the National Mall allowing for the land transfer and to mandate that the museum maintain diverse representation in exhibits.

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
